### **FEBRUARY HORTICULTURE TIPS**

This is the month for soil preparation and pruning so that your garden is Spring-ready! It is also an important month for planting trees, shrubs and roses.

**PRUNE:** Heavy pruning for size and shape may be completed on all but spring flowering shrubs and trees. (Do them after they bloom.) Prune out all dead and diseased branches. Remove unsightly shoots and suckers at the base. Crape Myrtle and others that bloom in the summer should be pruned. They bloom on new growth and will benefit from pruning and removal of old flowerheads. Camellia sasanqua is a shrub that requires pruning now.

Our winter has been so mild some traditional rules may not apply. Buds are already appearing on azalea and spirea so be very careful. Always prune on a slant to shed water. If the prune is flat, the stalk absorbs water, which is not good!

**FERTILIZE:** Shade trees and flowering trees need a balanced fertilizer spread beneath and slightly beyond the spread of the branches. Water in well.

**WARNING:** A nasty beetle is at work on the Bay trees in our area. An ugly black fungus-like color appears. You must remove the Bay tree as it will spread rapidly to other plants.
