MARCH HORTICULTURAL TIPS

March is a wonderful month for gardeners! The average last frost date for the coastal area is March 15. As soon as that danger is past, you can begin to brighten the landscape with petunias, impatiens, lantana, begonias et al.

PRUNE: If shrubs have been badly damaged by the cold, be patient. When new growth begins to appear you will know how much of the plant actually needs to be cut. Even if the entire plant appears dead, wait to replace it. Many will grow back from the crowns. Delay pruning of azalea and spring blooming shrubs until after bloom.

FERTILIZE: It is not necessary to wait until after blooming to fertilize azaleas and other spring blooming plants. Water well to wash the fertilizer into the soil.
