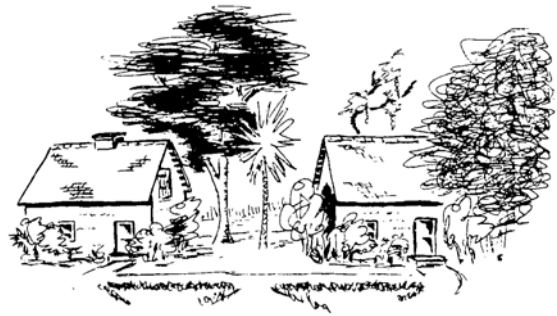

NOVEMBER HORTICULTURE TIPS:

- *Plant – It's time to plant or transplant trees and shrubs. Dig a \$10 hole for a \$2 plant!
- *Divide – Perennials, iris, daylilies and transplant.
- *Prune - Cut chrysanthemum stems to a 5" height after they have finished blooming.
 - Prune shrubs and trees only to remove overly vigorous shoots.
- *Force - Bulbs for indoor winter bloom.
