The Cassina Products committee has been working hard this year to add new retail venues and replenish product inventories at new and existing retail venues. We currently have 23 retail and tourism vendor sites, with 19 of them actively selling product.

Thanks to our great cabin docents, products sales have also been brisk throughout the summer tour months. As of August 1st, total sales for the year are about \$3,500. All cookbook/product sale funds are used to maintain the historic cabins, as outlined in our By-Laws.

We will continue to actively sell and increase distribution, adding more retail and tourism venues in the months ahead. We also plan to aggressively sell decorated Coastal Cookery books and ornaments during the 2013 Cassina Christmas Tour on Sea Island.

Wreath Making at the Vine Tuesday, November 5, 2013


