Docent Training for new members and other interested members will be Wednesday, September 16, at 10:00 in the Meeting Cabin.

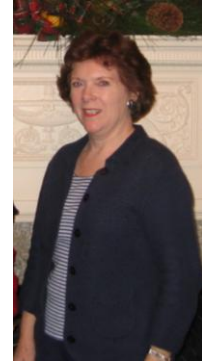
## Website Wins National Award

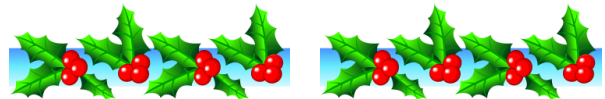
## 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Christmas Tour of Homes

If you haven't visited the Meeting Cabin this summer, you are in for a wonderful surprise. Glass enclosed bookcases and lucite-covered hanging panels provide a secure and visually-pleasing way to tell both the story of the Island and Cassina. You may not recognize the stately oak pictured on the right ... but it is located in front of the Cabins by Arthur J. Moore Drive. The glorious natural spreading habit of the Live Oak has been hidden for years by unsightly undergrowth. Janis Rodriguez and her husband Cesar decided that it was time for the specimen oak to show her beauty. They spent many weeks during the hot summer clearing out the weeds and other debris to reveal this beautiful sight. We all truly appreciate the Rodriguez's initiative and hard work!



## September Gardening

Yes, cooler weather will be coming...and with it, gardening that is more pleasant. The warning for this month is to watch for fungus and insect problems that might come with cool damp nights and warm days. Mildew, especially on crape myrtle, zinnias, and roses, can be expected. Use a fungicide and be sure to spray the top and the bottom of leaves.

### Lawns

A complete fertilizer should be applied to the lawn in mid to late September. Watch for insect damage (sod webworms, chinch bugs, and mole crickets). If there is mole cricket damage to your lawn, this is the last month to apply mole cricket bait. Brown patch fungus disease can attack St. Augustine, centipede, or Bermuda grass when the days are warm and the nights are cool and wet. If grass dies in circular areas (5 to 6 feet), apply a lawn fungicide.

### Shrubs and Trees

Cosmetic pruning of shrubs can be done now, but avoid any major pruning after early September. Fertilize shrubs and young trees for maximum growth and cold hardiness this month. The final azalea fertilizer should be applied mid-September to stimulate good bud set for the next year's bloom period. This should also be the last time you fertilize palms until next March. Using a palm fertilizer will insure that the plants get the needed micronutrients.

If you plan to transplant any shrubs or small trees this winter, now is the time to "root prune" them. Cut a circle around the plant at the drip line so new roots will form close to the plant.

### Annuals

This is not a good time to plant cool weather annuals, but the University of Florida recommends planting digitalis (foxglove) for spring bloom. In our area, digitalis must be treated as an annual, but at least deer don't like it.

### Perennials

Any perennials that have finished blooming can be divided and replanted at this time. It is a good time to divide daylilies. Cut the daylily leaves back to 12-14 inches and replant at the same depth.

### Vegetables

According to the University of Florida, these vegetables can be planted in our area this month: snap beans, pole beans, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, lettuce, cucumber, bulbing or bunching onions, radishes, and summer squash.

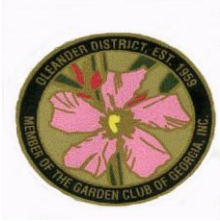
